GUARDIENT V3.0 — FULL PLATFORM RELEASE

Guardient v3.0 will replace the current platform on **May 1, 2026**. The release delivers a complete UI revamp alongside a new generation of built-in solutions, including a redesigned Case Management workflow, an integrated GRC platform, a Zero Trust platform, and additional capabilities all unified under a single pane of glass. Expect tighter workflows, faster navigation, and meaningful improvements to day-to-day analyst and administrator experience.

GITHUB & GITLAB LOG INGESTION

Guardient now ingests audit logs from enterprise GitHub and GitLab accounts, giving your SOC visibility into source control and CI/CD activity alongside endpoint, network, and cloud telemetry. With supply chain attacks like the recent Trivy compromise abusing trusted GitHub Actions to silently exfiltrate credentials from CI/CD pipelines, monitoring repository and pipeline events has moved from a nice-to-have to a baseline control. Detect tag tampering, unauthorized workflow changes, suspicious clone activity, and credential theft as it happens — not after the fact.

TRIVY SUPPLY CHAIN COMPROMISE — CI/CD SECRETS AT RISK

On March 19, 2026, a threat actor force-pushed 76 of 77 version tags in the *aquasecurity/trivy-action* repository and published a malicious Trivy v0.69.4 binary, injecting credential-stealing malware into CI/CD pipelines globally. Compromised pipelines silently exfiltrated GitHub tokens, AWS/GCP/Azure credentials, SSH keys, and Kubernetes secrets while scans appeared to complete normally. Tracked as CVE-2026-33634. **Action required:** Pin all GitHub Actions to full commit SHAs (not version tags), update to Trivy v0.69.3 or earlier, and rotate any secrets accessible to workflows that ran during the exposure window. Review your org for repositories named *tpcp-docs* as a possible indicator of compromise.

SURGE IN DOCUSIGN-THEMED PHISHING CAMPAIGNS

ESET telemetry recorded a **250% spike** in DocuSign-themed phishing detections in the second half of 2025, with campaigns continuing to evolve through early 2026. Current attack patterns include OAuth consent phishing (where users are tricked into granting third-party app access to Microsoft 365 or Google Workspace), QR code phishing (“quishing”) embedded in PDF attachments, and malware downloads disguised as signed documents. DocuSign has issued multiple fraud alerts on seasonal-themed scams and HR/payroll impersonation campaigns. **Recommended:** Brief your team to verify all DocuSign envelopes by going directly to docusign.com and entering the 32-character security code from the bottom of the email — never click links in unexpected requests.
